## Faculty to choose one of the evaluation models

- 1. Students receiving a letter grade: It is the joint responsibility of the student and the faculty member to formulate a plan delineating the expectations for the 299 course and the assessment methodology. These agreements should articulate educational objectives, the requested unit count, and the faculty's approach to instruction, evaluation, number of 1:1 meetings established during the quarter and grade assignment criteria. Such agreements serve as written confirmation of the faculty's endorsement to support the student for academic credit. The compiled information will be employed as the foundation for resolving any inquiries concerning the responsibilities of either the student or the faculty sponsor. Filing this agreement is imperative and should be completed no later than the third week of class.
- 2. Students receiving a Satisfactory/ Unsatisfactory grade: The grading criteria must be deliberated between the faculty and the student before finalizing the research agreement. It is the student's obligation to submit all work to their faculty before the last day of instruction.
