University Committee on Academic Computing and Communications Statement on Senate Regulation 542*

The University Committee on Academic Computing and Communications finds that <u>Senate Regulation</u> 542 does not preclude providing, at the instructor's discretion, access to electronic resources for students with an intent to complete the course. Students on the waiting list, enrolling through Extension, or making up incomplete grades are among those an instructor may decide to grant, individually or by category, access to selected course resources.
