As discussed at our joint UCOLASC and Council of University Librarians (CoUL) meeting held on February 21, 2025, UCOLASC remains committed to advancing the goals established in its 2018 "Declaration of Rights and Principles to Transform Scholarly Communication" and to uphold efforts of the Project Transform Negotiating Team (PTNT) and Project Transform Working Group (PTWG).

Thus, UCOLASC has unanimously endorsed the following statement to reflect its unwavering support of the PTNT in negotiating open access agreements on behalf of all UC authors:

"The University Committee on Library and Scholarly Communication (UCOLASC), hereby signals its collective and resolute commitment to support the negotiating position of the University of California (UC) with Elsevier and other publishers in order to advance UC's mission as a public institution, make the products of our research and scholarship as freely and widely available as possible, enable authors to retain all their rights as creators, and ensure that UC spends taxpayer money in the most ethically, morally, and socially responsible way.

To this end, UCOLASC calls for UC to enter into open access agreements with publishers whereby open access publishing and Creative Commons Attribution licenses (CC BY) are default for all our authors. UCOLASC does so with the acknowledgement that a limited number of UC authors may require additional publishing and licensing options for reasons that are discipline-specific and related to academic freedom—but such options should not restrict the rights of authors.

Pursuing 100% open access publishing agreements advances the goals set forth in the UCOLASC Declaration of Rights and Principles to Transform Scholarly Communication and aligns closely with the mission of the University to provide "long-term societal benefits through transmitting advanced knowledge, discovering new knowledge, and functioning as an active working repository of organized knowledge."

We thank you, the other members of the PTNT, PTWG, and CoUL for your efforts on our behalf, and we remain by your side with firm resolve.
