SUBJECT: Proposal to change the name of the University of California, Davis School of Veterinary Medicine to the *University of California, Davis Joan and Sanford I. Weill School of Veterinary Medicine*

The School of Veterinary Medicine (SVM) Faculty Executive Committee (FEC) met on Monday November 10, 2025 in a special meeting called by the committee Chair on Thursday November 6, 2025 to discuss the proposed change in school name. Of the 8 committee members, 7 were available to attend the meeting. Prior to the meeting, the SVM Dean, Mark Stetter, distributed relevant documents to the SVM FEC members for review.

FEC Chair Lein invited Dean Stetter and the SVM Assistant Dean of Advancement, Leeann Jansen, to join the November 10 meeting to answer FEC questions about the basis for the proposed school name change. Following the approximately 50-min Q&A session, Dean Stetter and Assistant Dean Jansen were excused from the committee meeting and the FEC members held a closed meeting for approximately 10 min. During the closed-door discussion, the committee unanimously agreed to endorse this proposal: 7 yes, 0 no, 0 abstained (out of 8 eligible faculty members). FEC Chair Lein followed up with the 8th FEC member who was unable to attend the meeting because of teaching responsibilities, and they also strongly supported the proposal.

The proposal to change the school name is based on significant philanthropic merit. Joan and Sanford (Sandy) Weill are generously gifting \$120,000,000 to further the mission and vision of the UC Davis School of Veterinary Medicine. This is the largest philanthropic gift to date for a school or college of veterinary medicine in the world and will support education and service through the construction of the new small animal hospital (\$80,000,000) and the school's research mission (\$40,000,000). In recognition of this historic and transformational gift, which will not entail any programmatic or curricular change, the SVM FEC strongly supports the proposal for a simple name change. *

For decades, the Joan and Sandy Weill have been true ambassadors of research and innovation in the pursuit of improving the lives of all beings. They have also been strong supporters of the UC Davis SVM, giving their first gift in 2018 to support the Veterinary Center for Clinical Trials (VCCT). Through their advocacy and support of clinical trials, the Weill's have championed the idea that collaboration across veterinary and human medicine is essential to unlocking new treatments and improving health outcomes in both animals and humans. As a result, in 2023, the Weill's established the *Joan Weill Translational Research Endowment* for \$5 million (including matching gifts) in support of the VCCT.

Introduction

Joan and Sanford (Sandy) Weill are generously gifting \$120,000,000 to further the mission and vision of the UC Davis School of Veterinary Medicine. This is the largest philanthropic gift to date for a school or college of veterinary medicine in the world and will support education and service through the construction of the new small animal hospital (\$80,000,000) and our research mission (\$40,000,000).

In collaboration with Chancellor Gary May, and after a thorough campus consultation process, I am writing to propose renaming the University of California Davis School of Veterinary Medicine to the *University of California Davis Joan and Sanford I. Weill School of Veterinary Medicine*. This naming has been approved by University of California President, James B. Milliken.

This name change will not entail any programmatic or curricular change. Therefore, and after consultation with the Office of the President and consistent with the UC Academic Senate Compendium*, it has been determined that this naming qualifies as a “simple name change”.

In recognition of this historic and transformational gift, this request for a simple name change is respectfully submitted for consideration and approval. This change will not have any impact on the existing curriculum or service delivery.

Brief Bio

Joan and Sanford “Sandy” Weill are a remarkable couple whose shared commitment to leadership, philanthropy, and community service have made a lasting impact across education, healthcare, the arts and social justice. Sandy is a pioneering figure in American finance, best known as the architect behind Citigroup, where his innovative vision helped shape the modern financial services industry. Prior to his retirement, Sandy served as chief executive officer of Citigroup until 2003 and as chairman of the board until 2006. During his tenure with Citigroup, he orchestrated the 1998 merger between Citicorp and the Travelers Group to form Citigroup.

Typically, a simple name change is sought to accommodate popular and accepted changes in nomenclature of an academic field or discipline. It is a change that is not associated with any substantive modification to curricular offerings or resource needs of academic programs and units.

In 2017, Forbes included Sandy on its list of the World's 100 Greatest Living Business Minds. In 2014, Sandy was named to CNBC's First 25, a list of 25 people with the greatest influence on business during the preceding quarter century. He was the recipient of Financial World Magazine's CEO of the Year Award in 1998 and received the same honor from Chief Executive Magazine in 2002.

Joan is a dedicated philanthropist and community leader and has been equally influential through her work championing health, the performing arts and early childhood education. Together, they exemplify the power of combining business acumen with a deep sense of social responsibility.

The Weills' strong commitment to civic duty is reflected in their extensive volunteerism and service on nonprofit boards. Joan is a member of the board of overseers at UCSF, board member of the Lang Lang International Music Foundation, past president and board member of Citymeals-On-Wheels, and former executive committee member of Women in Need. Joan provided leadership as Chair and Chair Emerita of the Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater Foundation, where she has helped expand access to dance education.

Sandy has served in numerous volunteer leadership roles as well including Chairman of Carnegie Hall, Past Chair and current member of UCSF Executive Council, Member of the Board of Visitors at UC Berkeley, and as a trustee of Cornell University, his alma mater. Sandy founded and served as Chairman for the National Academy Foundation, a national education nonprofit, that brings schools and businesses together to better prepare students of all backgrounds, reflecting their lifelong belief that education is the cornerstone of opportunity.

Philanthropy stands at the heart of Joan and Sandy's shared legacy. Their generosity has touched countless lives through transformative gifts to medical research, higher education and community programs. Among their most significant contributions are those to: Weill Cornell Medicine, UCSF Weill Institute for Neurosciences, Weill Cancer Hub East and Weill Cancer Hub West. Joan and Sandy are the recipients of the 2009 Carnegie Medal of Philanthropy, 2017 Kennedy Center Award for the Human Spirit, and 2022 Forbes 400 Lifetime Achievement Award for Philanthropy.

Engagement with UC Davis, UC Davis School of Veterinary Medicine (SVM)

The Weill's were introduced to the SVM and the role veterinary medicine plays in advancing both animal and human health in January 2018, when their beloved dog Angel, an 11-year-old Bichon Frise, was diagnosed with lymphoma. Angel's lymphoma was in an advanced stage, and she was enrolled in a veterinary clinical trial at SVM. The trial enhanced Angel's quality of life while also contributing valuable insights to research that may have benefited other dogs in the future.

Due to the wonderful care and treatment of Angel by Dr. Robert Rebhun and his team, the Weill's made their first gift in support of the Veterinary Center for Clinical Trials (VCCT) in 2018. Through their advocacy and support of clinical trials, they have championed the idea that collaboration across veterinary and human medicine is essential to unlocking new treatments and improving health outcomes in both animals and humans. As a result, in 2023, the Weills established the *Joan Weill Translational Research Endowment* for \$5 million (including matching gifts) in support of the VCCT. For decades, the Weill's have been true ambassadors of research and innovation in the pursuit of improving the lives of all beings. Dedicating their time, expertise, and resources to advancing science and training the next generation of world-class minds.

Joan and Sandy also embody the spirit of volunteer leadership. Sandy has been an active and engaged volunteer for UC Davis, serving on the UC Davis Chancellor's Board of Advisors since 2014, as a commencement speaker for the Graduate School of Management, and hosting UC Davis students and faculty at their home, among many other engagements throughout the university over the years.

In addition to this new \$120,000,000, the Weill's have also previously given an additional \$3,000,000 to the School of Veterinary Medicine. Furthermore, the Weill's have been generous donors to other UC Campuses including giving more than \$390,000,000 to UC San Francisco and UC Berkeley. In total this means, the Weill's have given over half a billion dollars to further the vision and values of the University of California.

Accelerated Review

The School of Veterinary Medicine has an immediate need for expanded teaching and clinical space within the Small Animal Hospital. A nationwide shortage of veterinarians, combined with a steadily increasing patient demand, has created significant pressure on our existing facilities. The proposed expansion will enable us to increase our annual patient capacity from 50,000 to 70,000+ animals, strengthening both our educational program and the delivery of high-quality veterinary care. Concurrently, the school plans to expand enrollment in the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) program from 155 to 200 students per class, addressing workforce need while enhancing clinical learning opportunities.

Joan and Sandy, 91 and 92 years old respectively, understand our facility limitations and recognizing the urgency of these challenges, support the initiation of this project as critical to meeting the growing needs of our students, faculty and the veterinary community. Given the donors' advanced age, we respectfully request that action proceed as swiftly as possible to allow them the opportunity to fully experience and appreciate the impact of their generous gift.
