# RE: Request to give faculty and staff work flexibility during the pandemic

UCFW is asking the Academic Council to urge the Chancellors to involve faculty and staff representatives in the planning process for "re-opening" the campuses.

As you know, even under the most ambitious timelines, the Covid-19 pandemic will probably remain a threat during the entire 2020-2021 academic year. Due to the closure of schools and daycare centers, many faculty and staff have had to homeschool their children. Many are also involved in the care of yet older and more-at-risk parents as well as others with compromised immune systems. In addition, many faculty and a large number of staff belong to higher-risk groups for Covid-19. Based on the roster of active faculty who participate in the UC Retirement Plan, almost half are 50 years or older (and almost a quarter are aged 60 or over). Based on UC's staff workforce profile, more than a third of career employees are over 50 years old.

Increasing flexibility for faculty and staff to work remotely during the pandemic would help safeguard the health of our campus community and send a clear signal that UC cares for its students, staff, and faculty during these difficult times.
