At its September 23, 2020 meeting, the Academic Council endorsed the attached recommendation from the University Committee on Preparatory Education (UCOPE) to accept an ACT English + Reading score of 63 or higher as a new method of satisfying the Entry Level Writing Requirement (ELWR), permanently effective for new students applying for UC admission in November 2020 and enrolling in Fall 2021. The change is timely and appropriate given that one method of satisfying the ELWR is through a minimum ACT ELA score that is calculated using the ACT Writing Test, which UC has just dropped as an admission requirement.

RE: ACT ENGLISH + READING AND SATISFACTION OF THE ELWR

Dear Mary,

Currently, UC allows an ACT English Language Arts (ELA) score of 30 or higher to satisfy ELWR; the calculation of the ELA score requires that the student take ACT's optional Writing section. UC has now dropped the ACT Writing Test (and SAT Essay) as a UC admission requirement effective for fall 2021 admissions. Our expectation is that fewer students will take the optional ACT Writing test going forward, though the ACT ELA score can continue to be used to satisfy ELWR if official scores are received. UCOPE asked Institutional Research (IR) at UCOP to analyze if the ACT English + Reading score would be an appropriate method of satisfying Entry Level Writing Requirement (ELWR), in lieu of (or in addition to) the ACT English Language Arts (ELA) score.

The College Board and ACT have collaborated on a concordance table that shows a concordance of the SAT Evidenced-Based Reading and Writing (EBRW) score of 680 to the ACT English + Reading score of 61. Currently ELWR can be met by SAT EBRW score of 680 or higher. However, based on the IR analysis, UCOPE has voted to allow the ACT English + Writing score of 63 or higher as a new method of satisfying ELWR on a permanent basis.

The committee requests that Academic Council endorse our recommendation to accept an ACT English + Reading score of 63 or higher as a new method of satisfying ELWR on a permanent basis effective beginning with new students enrolling in Fall 2021 (students applying to UC in November 2020). Undergraduate Admissions at UCOP should be notified about this decision.

ACT English + Reading Scores and the Entry Level Writing Requirement

Incoming University of California students must demonstrate proficiency in writing in English by meeting the Entry Level Writing Requirement (ELWR) before entering or by taking a designated writing course after enrolling at UC. Students can meet this requirement before entry by achieving a score at or above certain thresholds on specific AP, IB, SAT, or ACT exams, passing a UC transferrable English composition course at a college or university, or passing UC’s Analytical Writing Placement Exam (AWPE). (See Appendix Table 1 for a list of ways to meet the ELWR.).

KEY FACTS

- As SAT EBRW scores approach 680, the share passing the AWPE approaches 60%.
- As ACT ELA scores approach 30, the share passing the AWPE fluctuates closely around 60%.
- As ACT E+R scores approach 65, the share passing the AWPE fluctuates around 60%.

Currently students can meet the ELWR with an ACT ELA score of 30 or higher, but only those who take the optional Writing section have ACT ELA scores. UC has now dropped the SAT Essay/ACT Writing tests as a UC admission requirement effective for fall 2021 admissions, so it is likely that fewer students entering UC will have ACT ELA scores. The University Committee on Preparatory Education (UCOPE) is considering whether to allow students to meet the ELWR with ACT English + Reading (ACT E+R) scores, and if so, what threshold to use.

This analysis uses data from the fall 2019 freshman admissions cycle to compare SAT EBRW, ACT ELA, and ACT E+R scores to scores on UC’s own AWPE. The analysis covers students who plan to enroll at UC as indicated by submitting a Statement of Intent to Register, referred to as “SIRs” in this analysis. During this cycle, almost one-quarter (24%) of SIRs had AWPE scores (Table 1). Most SIRs (86%) had SAT EBRW scores, and over one-third (37%) had ACT ELA and ACT E+R scores. Many students took more than one of these tests. Table 1 also shows the range of possible scores for each test score type.

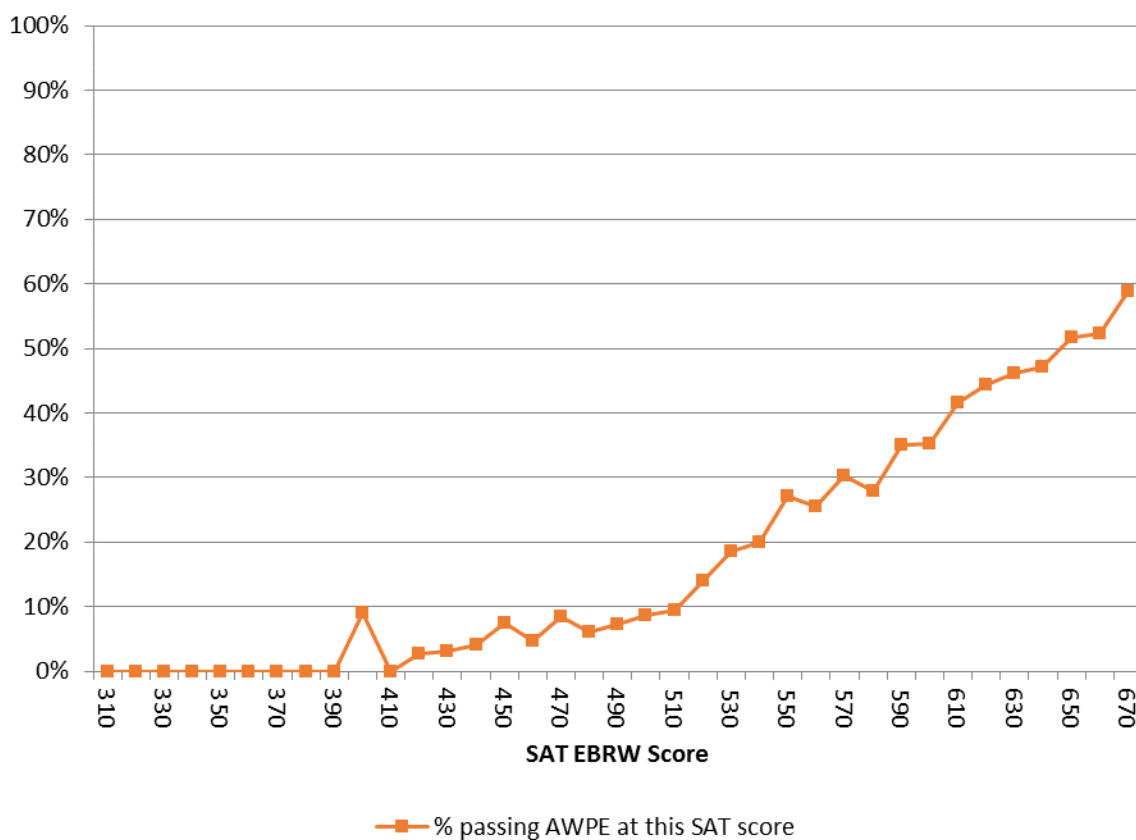

SAT EBRW scores vs. AWPE scores

In the fall 2019 admissions cycle, over 10,200 students planning to enroll at UC had AWPE scores and also SAT EBRW scores. In general, as SAT EBRW scores go up, the share passing the AWPE goes up (Figure 1 and Appendix Table 2a). Since students who achieved a 680 or higher on SAT EBRW met ELWR, they generally did not take the AWPE. As the SAT EBRW score approaches 680, the share passing the AWPE approaches 60%. This suggests that 60% or more of those with SAT EBRW scores of 680 or higher would have passed the AWPE.

Figure 1. Share passing AWPE by SAT EBRW Score, Fall 2017 SIRs

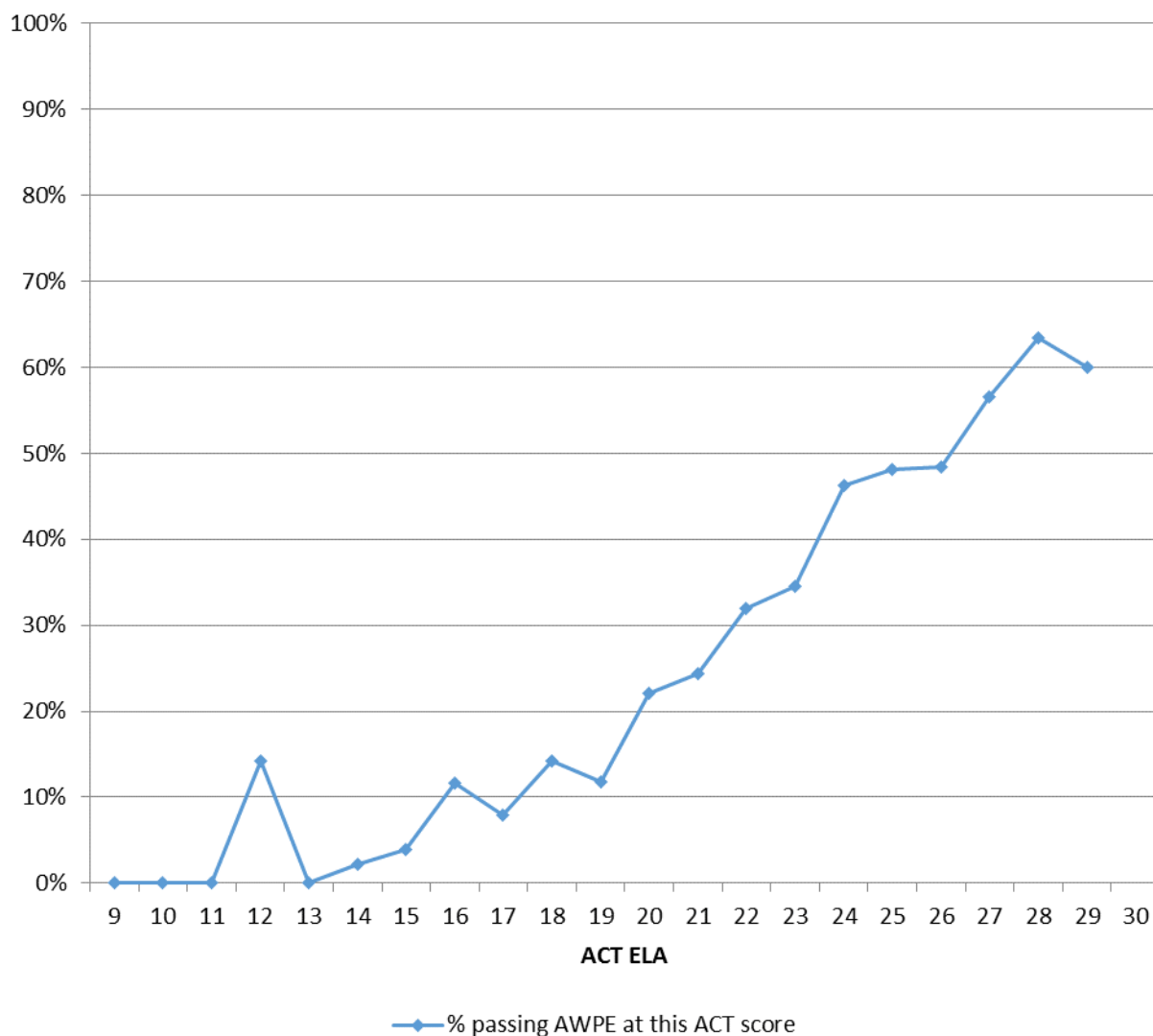


It is also important to consider how many students met the ELWR threshold for this test score. Looking at all SIRs with SAT EBRW scores, not just those who also took the AWPE, 37% achieved a 680 or higher (Appendix Table 2b).

ACT ELA vs. AWPE scores

In the fall 2019 admissions cycle, over 4,300 students planning to enroll at UC took both the AWPE and the ACT ELA. Since students achieving an ACT ELA score of 30 or higher did not have to take the AWPE, we do not know how many of them would have passed the AWPE. Looking at those with ACT ELA scores below 30, the share of students passing the AWPE generally increases as the ACT ELA score increases (Figure 2 and Appendix Table 3a). As the ACT ELA score approaches 30, the share passing the AWPE fluctuates closely around 60%. This suggests that 60% or more of students scoring 30 or higher on ACT ELA would have passed the AWPE.

Figure 2. Share passing AWPE by ACT ELA Score, Fall 2019 SIRs

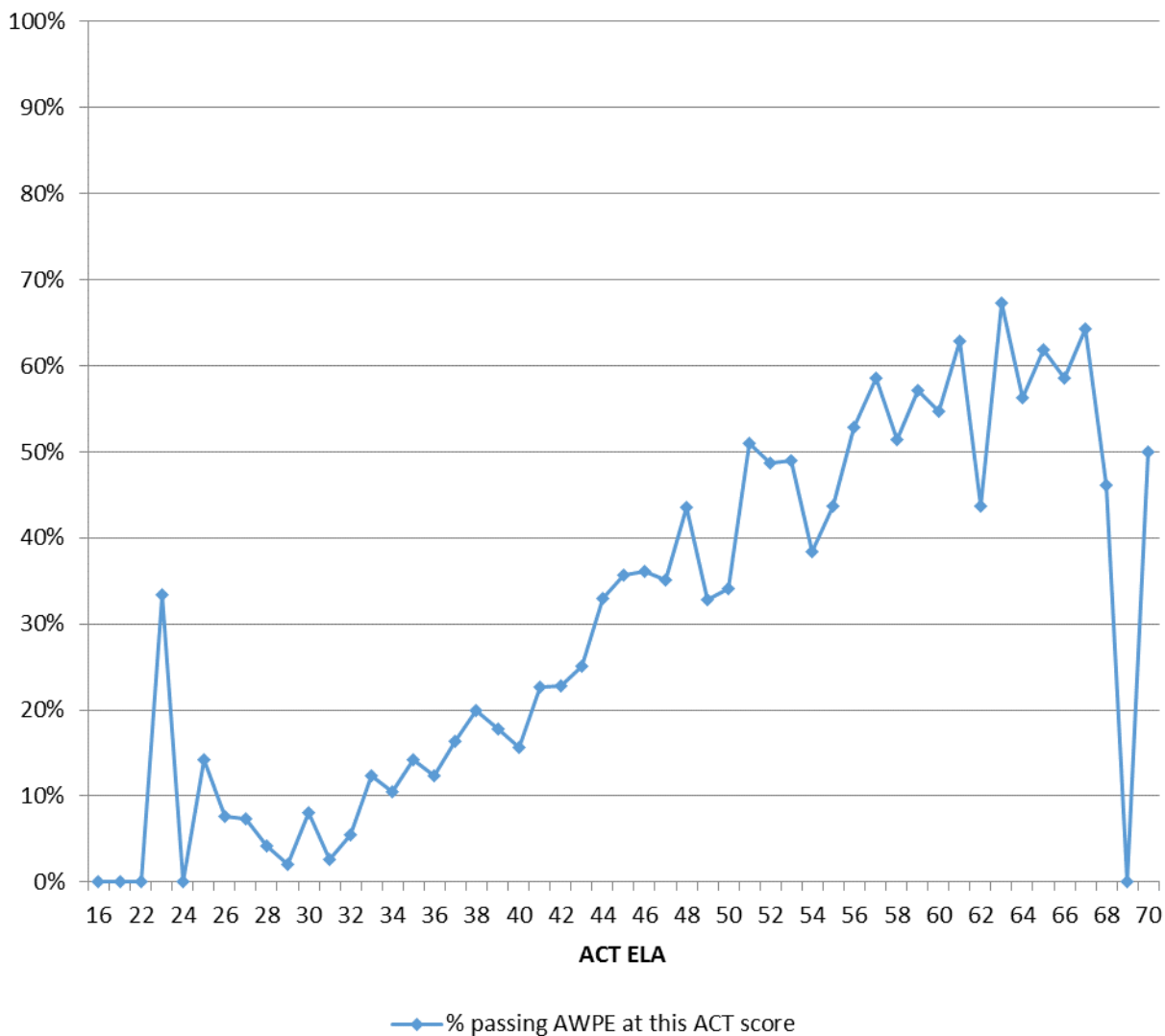


In fall 2019, 31% of all those with ACT ELA scores met the threshold of 30 or higher (Appendix Table 3b).

ACT E+R scores vs. AWPE scores

For the fall 2019 admissions cycle, over 4,300 students have scores for both the AWPE and the ACT E+R. The share of students passing AWPE generally increases as ACT E+R scores increase, but there is considerable fluctuation in AWPE passing rates, especially for the highest and lowest ACT E+R scores (Figure 3 and Appendix Table 4a). It is important to note that relatively few students achieving the highest ACT E+R scores took the AWPE because many met the ELWR using other methods. (See Appendix Table 1 for a list of methods.) For example, only 102 students with ACT E+R scores of 65 or higher also took the AWPE. Nonetheless, these are the best data available to examine the relationship between ACT E+R and AWPE scores. Among those achieving ACT E+R scores of 55, 44% passed the AWPE. At a score of 60, 55% passed the AWPE, and at a score of 65, 62% passed the AWPE.

Looking at all ACT E+R test takers, regardless of whether they took the AWPE, the majority (58%) achieved a score of 55 or higher. A little less than half (47%) of all test takers achieved a score of 60 or higher, while only 34% had a score of 65 or higher (Appendix Table 4b).

It is also helpful to note that the College Board/ACT concordance shows an ACT E+R score of 61 as equivalent to the current ELWR threshold of 680 for the SAT EBRW. This suggests that ACT E+R scores close to 61 may be appropriate thresholds.

Recommendation

UCOPE should accept ACT E+R scores for meeting ELWR and set a threshold score of 65. As ACT E+R scores approach 65, the share passing the AWPE is fluctuating around 60%. The share of all ACT E+R test-takers with a 65 or higher is over one-third (34%). Among those who scored 65 or higher on the ACT E+R and took the AWPE, 58% passed the AWPE. Note that a threshold of 63 would result in a higher share passing the AWPE at that score (67%) and a higher share of test-takers achieving the threshold or higher (39%). For all those scoring 63 or 64 on the ACT E+R, the AWPE passing rate is 62%. For all those with a 63 or higher, the AWPE passing rate is 60%. Going strictly by the data, a score of 63 on the ACT E+R would make the best threshold, but there is value in rounding up to 65 to get a threshold that is easier to remember.
